The Interview

After the application process you were shortlisted and called for an interview with the Character Team.

At your interview you showed mastery of communication as well as exceptional skills and a great deal of practical wisdom. It is clear you know how to take Social Action and have considerable interest in it.

Some of those being interviewed are already taking action with their families outside of school. Many are already supporting those leading change within school. It is really exciting that you will now be joining this group of impressive young leaders.

Soon you will be taking part in an induction programme to develop your skills further. This will include participating in some external workshops. These workshops are specially designed to enhance your skills in Public Speaking. Obviously, as a young leader you will need to be able to put forward your views confidently. This may involve speaking in an assembly or making a presentation within school, sitting on a young people's advisory board and even leading a project with peers alongside a charitable or national organisation.

As a Special Agent of Change you will work alongside an extraordinary group of young leaders who passionately inspire, motivate others and reflect on a range of actions that we are currently exploring. Together with them, you will be able to make decisions on current projects relating to those within the classroom, the school and the wider local community. You may even come across National and Global Social Action activities.

Be ready to be inspired by a wide range of other like-minded individuals including those special visitors who may be invited to speak with you. These role models may have already engaged in exciting sustained Social Action.




They are everywhere!

Good and wise choices are ours to make. Others are impacted by the decisions we make.



Character Caught

You have been observing virtues in action for a long time both in the classroom and throughout the school. Our excellent role models in school have provided you with the opportunity to learn more from their attitudes, behaviour and interactions with others.





Character Taught

By now it has become very clear to you that the Virtues are with you at all times, whether at home, school or beyond school. They are interconnected and form the building blocks for all the character learning that we take part in. There are many more virtues beyond the ones that we have chosen together.

In school virtues are introduced to you and taught through projects and topics, often through story. You have learned about virtues in your lessons, assemblies and in other activities.

Character Sought

Now that you have become a Special Agent of Change you will be able to support the school in seeking opportunities to demonstrate how virtues make a difference to us as well as others. They aid us in making good and wise choices. Virtues in action enable us to understand their impact on us as well as others. There is a double effect.

Meaningful Social Action

We all know that to undertake meaningful Social Action you have to clearly understand what it means to make a positive difference to others. You have already started to identify what it is to be a 'good' citizen. This has been demonstrated through using the Character Virtues that have been embedded in your learning. These are what we call the building blocks to our character development both in and outside of school. You have taken each one of these virtues in turn and seen how they work together to help us become who we are.
