#### **Activity 2:** Two Donkeys

Read through the story of the two donkeys from the PowerPoint, you could get two volunteers to act it out.

#### Discuss:

- How could the donkeys solve the problem?
- What virtues would they need?
- What will happen if they don't?

Explain that solving conflict involves working together to find a solution that everyone is happy with.

#### **Activity 3:** Role play

Explain that the children are going to practice solving friendship conflicts through role plays. Recap some of the techniques to solve conflict that they mentioned in the discussion activity.

In small groups, give each group a role play scenario. They need to act out the scenario twice – once with a positive outcome and once with a negative outcome.

What virtues are needed to ensure a positive outcome?

**Plenary**: Opportunities to practise

Are there opportunities at school to support others to be friends? This might be a friendship bench, peer mediators etc. If there are not, could you start one?
