How to use the book mark

- Cut out the bookmark from this sheet. Use a hole punch to create a hole at the top of the bookmark and thread through ribbon or string. Ask your child to draw or decorate the other side of the bookmark.
- Speak with your child/children about what virtues are. The <u>Character Framework</u> offers a useful summary of some of the virtues and what it means to be a virtuous person.
- Similarly, you may be interested to read our <u>Knightly Virtues</u> report on 'Enhancing Virtue Literacy through Stories'.
- You can use the bookmark with any book or you could use it with one of the books on our reading list.
- When your child is reading or when you are reading with them, ask them to think about some of the questions listed on the bookmark.
- You could answer some of the question as you read the story or wait until the end of the book.
