# TELLING THE TRUTH

#### **SESSION B**



#### **LEARNING OBJECTIVES:**

Children know that it is always best to tell the truth, even if they might get into trouble.

Children understand the meaning of 'honesty is the best policy'.

## **Suggested Resources:**

Copy of *The Boy Who Cried Wolf*, plain paper and colouring pencils.

#### Script:

Remind children of last week's lesson. What did we learn? Why should we be honest? Read the story of *The Boy Who Cried Wolf* and discuss the consequences of not telling the truth.

### **Character Coaching**

#### Meaningful Praise:

Thank you for being honest.

Thank you for admitting what you did, I appreciate your honesty.

#### Guidance:

Remember that being honest is very important because it helps people to know that you can be trusted.

## **Suggested Activities:**

At tables, give children some plain paper and pencils. They can draw a picture of an alternative ending to the story – what happened if the boy didn't cry wolf. Give children an opportunity at the end of the lesson to share and explain their drawings.

#### Correction:

How could you use honesty next time this happens? I need someone to practise honesty so that I know what really happened.

I was saddened that you did not practise honesty today. What will you do differently next time? Please practise honesty.
