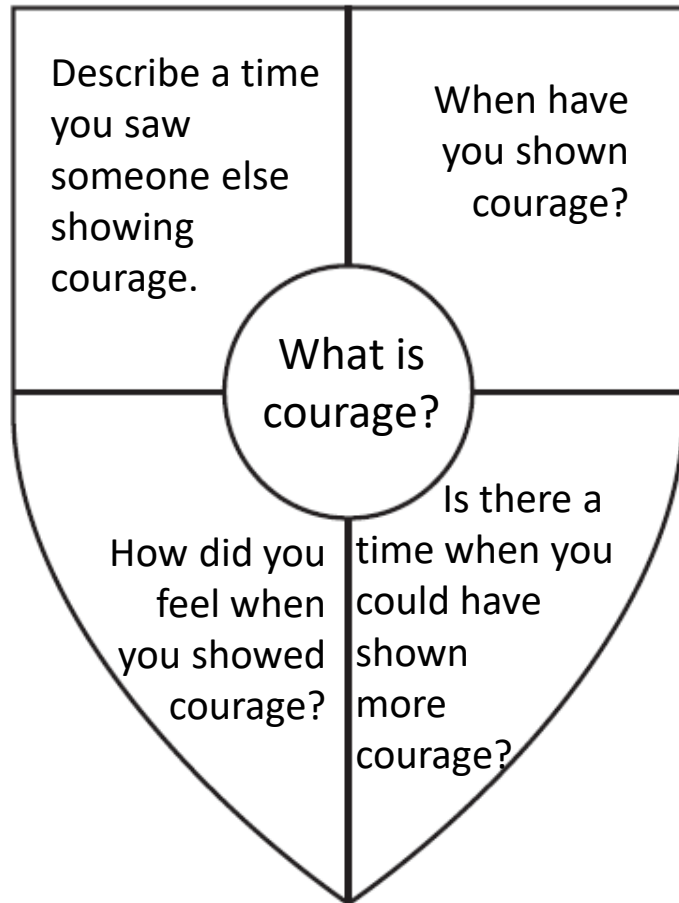


# Courage Shield

This is a short craft activity to get children to reflect on the virtue of courage.

1. On the page below there is a blank shield. You can either print the page out or draw the shield on a piece of paper.
2. Ask your child to fill in their shield based on the questions in the shield opposite (e.g., writing, drawing pictures, adding photos).
3. Once they have decorated their shield, stick it to some cardboard and cut it out.
4. Add a handle to the back of the shield using a strip of paper and some sticky tape.

Use the shield to remind your child they have courage (e.g., use as a visual aid when reading a book involving courage, stick on their bedroom wall or use for fancy dress!)



## Materials:

- Plain Paper
- Cardboard
- Sticky tape or glue
- Crayons/felt tip pens
- Glitter/stickers
