Has this always been the case?	Using the PowerPoint, show the pictures representing the Queen, the Prime Minister, businesses, army, police and allow children to discuss the question of who rules the United Kingdom.	
What was the case before democracy? Who rules in other countries? What groups are powerful?	You may also want to discuss:  - Has it always been this way? Who ruled Britain in the past? - Is it the same for every country? - What does 'rule' mean? - Why might people argue that businesses rule?  Activity 1: What is a democracy?
